 Subjective signs: light headache, 1st grade angiopathy of retina (1 point), moderate headache, 2nd grade angiopathy of retina (2 points), severe headache, disfunction of vision correlated to 3rd grade angiopathy of retina, epigastric aches, nausea, vomiting (3 points).

Comments:

- Isolated systolic hypertension: systolic arterial pressure more or equal 140 mm Hg, diastolic arterial pressure less 90 mm Hg.
- If systolic and diastolic pressure belong to different categories, the highest category is given.
- According to the sum of the points a light form of Gestosis (1 to 12 points), moderate Gestosis (13 to 16 points), severe form of Gestosis (17 to 26 points) are distinguished.
